

The impact of IT operations automation on the morale, productivity and security posture of IT teams

According to 110 Australian IT professionals:


IT ops automation can improve security outcomes, lead to better productivity and reduce burnout.



Support automation if it means they can work less time out of normal hours.



Say automation tools could improve overall security by shortening patch cycles, reducing vulnerability exposure timeframes and lessening time spent on incident response.



Want to adopt automation tools so they can work on more meaningful projects.



Almost half (43%) of IT teams waste up to 3 days per month (between 11 and 20 hours) fixing human errors, with 17% spending a minimum of three days per month resolving mistakes.
